Its priorities – quality of service, value for money – are those of its customers. Its concerns – comfort, safety and smooth journeys – reflect those of its users. In order to keep pace with changes in transportation needs, **Veolia Transport** also organizes on-demand transport services, so that all its customers, notably those with reduced mobility, have access to an appropriate transport solution that operates in synergy with the regular public transport lines in areas or at times where no transportation solution previously existed. Taxi services are front-line partners in the provision of this type of service.
