INTERNATIONAL INNOVATIONS IN URBAN MOBILITY

The City on the Move Institute's international competition for student journalists

Launched in September 2003, with the theme "innovative services in urban mobility", the competition was highly international with participating teams from Belgium, Brazil, Denmark, Ecuador, USA and France.

For this third running of the competition, the international jury in session on 11 June 2004 nominated two teams:

"Hope on the back seat"

The aim of the "**Mototaxi**" service is to provide an additional form of public transport in certain Brazilian cities, notably Franca (São Paulo Province). The "Mototaxis" are a low-cost method of urban transport and also generate jobs.

The jury was attracted by this feature with its focus on alternative solutions for a mobility problem that exists in all big cities. The Mototaxis are considered from every angle (advantages to customers, social impact, institutional limitations, road safety...). While concentrating on the human dimension and underpinning the investigation with key data, the articles also developed the concept of intermodality. A 15-minute TV documentary with an original format added a further dimension to the subject.

Special Prize

Louis OLIVIER and Damien FLEUROT CFJ - Journalism Training Centre / France Disability – Taming the City Their subject "**Disability** – **Taming the City**" shows how the new technologies can enhance access. The feature is made up of background articles, a case study of Champigny-sur-Marne, interviews with users and an audio report. The story is handled using an original journalistic form.
